In order to achieve these objectives, integrated language skills instruction is considered the most effective approach, as it teaches language as a tool for communication, which is motivating and realistic. Hinkel also highlighted that current integrated language skills teaching models aim to develop learners' fluency, accuracy, and sociocultural communicative competence by adapting language from context to context and from genre to genre. The main objective of English language learning is to develop communicative competence and the ability to use English for social, vocational, educational, and professional purposes, given the widespread use of

English as a global language. In EFL settings, the integrated-skills approach is considered the most effective method to achieve this goal.
